It is important to advise that my husband has authorized my son, Yan, who is Oscar’s stepson, to receive this honorable award on his behalf and to represent him along with Dr. Angel Garrido. Oscar would like for Yan to deposit the medal at the Lawton Foundation offices until Cuba is free. We consider this to be a fair choice since he raised Yan from a very young age and thinks of him as a son. In addition, Oscar responded that Yan has earned this right with his conduct. Besides sharing our ideals, Yan has been very busy due to his involvement with all aspects of Oscar’s situation. He has kept in contact with our friends from the Lawton Foundation of Human Rights whose vice-president is Dr. Angel Garrido. Yan, along with us, is a living testimony of the victims of Communism. Yan invited Winnie, Oscar’s other child, to attend the award ceremony with him. Oscar was happy that Winnie would be there with Yan to enjoy the moment too.
